- 2 Gristmill** - Watch as grain is ground into flour and learn about the highly skilled work of operating and maintaining the mill, which was the responsibility of the enslaved master miller, Caesar.
- 3 Manor House** - Learn about the daily lives of the enslaved families who lived and worked here.
- 4 Kitchen Garden** - Explore the many plants that the community would have grown here in the 1700s, and see a demonstration on making medicines from common herbs.
- 5 Beehive Oven** - See a demo of traditional 18th-century cooking methods.
- 6 Craft Stations** - Make your own Adinkra stamps, miniature drums, and flower crowns, or try your hand at tinsmithing!
- 7 Artist in Residence** - Installation by visual artist Nichole Washington.
